World Book Day will take place on Thursday 3rd March. We are asking the children to bring a book to school and come dressed as a character from that book or to bring a prop from the story. The chosen book needs to be a book of quality and not from a TV show. As part of a piece of homework nearer the time the children will be asked to write a short presentation about their character or prop. Thank you.

SAINSBURYS ACTIVE KIDS VOUCHERS

We would be very grateful for any Sainsburys Activkids vouchers that you (and your family!) collect. The vouchers can be handed in via the children, or into the collection point in the school reception. Thank you.

MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

If medicines are required to be administered at school please be aware that you will need to bring them in with the necessary forms completed (available from the school office), in their original packaging, un-opened and labelled with your child's name. Please note, the school policy for the administration of medicine states that members of staff are not allowed to administer Paracetamol, Calpol, Ibuprofen or any other over the counter painkillers, and pupils are not allowed to have cough sweets or syrups in school without a prescription from your doctor. If your child is unwell and need regular top ups of painkilling medicine, we ask that parents arrange to come into school to administer the medicine themselves or that the pupils are kept at home until they are well enough to get through the day without painkillers.

LETTINGS POLICY AND USE OF SCHOOL GROUNDS

When hiring the school hall for parties or events outside of school hours, our school lettings policy asks that the hirers only drive 1 essential car onto the playground for the purposes of unloading and ensure that the gate is partially closed to stop any other cars driving onto the playground. If you are collecting a child or attending an event at the school outside of school hours, please support our policy by parking in the front car park or on the road and walking through to the playground. Thank you.



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Emergency Procedures

Following parental feedback we would like to clarify emergency procedures such as lock down and fire drills, these are standard procedure in all schools. Unfortunately we can't advise parents in advance as they have to be unplanned for both staff and children. In the future we will mention in the Newsletter if we have had a drill.

Talking to Children about Terrorism

Unfortunately in today's world, terrorism is something that pupils will be aware of and may want to ask questions about. Our policy in school is to address any issues that children broach in an open, but age appropriate manner, and our staff are all trained to do so.




