- **❖ How much are we raising at present?** @£5500 per year, only 6% of families currently contribute.
- * How much would you like each family to donate per month? £10 per month per family in school raises £12000 per year (based on approx. 100 families) That's just 30p per day –the form is available on Governor page of the school website.
- ❖ How is the money being spent? Decisions on spending are taken after consultation between staff and governors. This year we have used just over £6000 to purchase equipment off teacher wish lists to support the English and maths curriculum. The Maths list includes additional practical learning aids so that each class can use the equipment simultaneously (following on from the Maths advisor visit and recommendations) and the English list will enable us to complete the Reading Scheme we are using. We are also holding £6000 in reserve to support the school budget for the next academic year and keep a balance of @£2000 in the account for emergencies or unforeseen items.
