Free School Meals (FSM) Vouchers

We are currently looking into how to supply vouchers to any of our pupils who are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) and we will be in touch with the relevant families with how this will work later in the week. Please note this does not include children who receive the universal KS1 government funded school meals however if your child is in KS1 and attending school due to being a key worker or vulnerable child then they will still receive their free school lunch, which should be ordered in the usual way.

We are aware that this further lockdown may result in parents losing work and an increase in families needing to apply for FSM. If your circumstances have changed and you feel you may be entitled to this please complete the form sent with this newsletter and return it to Helen in the office.
