Communication Week

Buckinghamshire Council's Early Years Service is launching a new campaign to highlight the importance of speech, language and communication on the development of children in their youngest years.

The recent Ofsted research into the effects of the COVID pandemi, highlighted the importance of parents when it comes to early childhood development. Inspectors found children's experiences were not necessarily determined by privilege or deprivation. Rather, parents who were able to spend more time talking to and reading with their children had had a positive impact on children's communication and language skills and these children had benefited from quality time spent with families and carers over the lockdown period.

'Communication Week', is taking place from 1st to 5th March (see flyer). The Early Years Service will be engaging with families and practitioners by sharing ideas, tips and resources on how to support a child's development through day-to-day interactions and communication. Childcare Vouchers

For months now, I have been battling to get the school registered to accept Childcare Vouchers for our Falcons club. I have been passed from Ofsted to Childcare Services and back again and finally wrote a formal letter of complaint to HMRC to try and get action. When I eventually did receive the code, I needed to set us up from the complaints department, it turned out to be the wrong code and didn't work! However, after another few calls, I have finally set us up! My thanks to Mrs Taylor for her patience and help in getting this sorted and for trialling it for us – it works! Yay! She has kindly provided information below for other parents who wish to use this service.

How to set up the school as a childcare provider from your childcare account.

- 1. Log in to your account
- 2. Go to 'Your Tax-Free Childcare account'
- 3. Go to 'manage account' against relevant child
- 4. Scroll down to the green banner saying 'add a childcare provider'
- 5. Put in the school name I just put 'Frieth'
- 6. The school comes up select the box to tick next to the name of the school
- 7. Press 'Continue'
- 8. It says 'Do you want to add this childcare provider for another child select yes for multiple children at the school.

The school's name then appears on the account under the selected child, which means you can now pay the school via this account! When you pay money into this account, it gets topped up 20% by the government and then you can use that new total to pay the school.
