

I know that some parents are having difficulty getting hold of inhalers at the moment, but please note that ideally, we prefer to have two in school for any children who suffer with asthma. This is so that one can be kept in the classroom with your child and taken out to P.E., while the other is kept in the office with your child's individual healthcare plans as a spare, in case the first one runs out, or for use at lunchtimes and breaktimes. Please do try to get the extra one if your child only has one in school. Likewise, we like to have two epi-pens in school for any child with a serious allergy.
