Uniform

We would like to remind all families that dogs are not permitted on the school site including the playground and pathways leading to the classrooms. This is to ensure the safety and comfort of all pupils, particularly those who may feel anxious around animals or have allergies.

Driving

We kindly ask all parents and carers to take extra care when driving near the school. Please remember to keep your speed low, stay fully attentive on the road, and avoid using mobile phones while driving. Your consideration helps keep our children safe and ensures a

Thank you for the overwhelmingly positive feedback in our recent parent questionnaires. It was wonderful to see how happy families are with the education we provide, how much children enjoy coming to school, and how highly you value the enrichment opportunities on offer.

A few comments queried class sizes with the growth of our school so I want to reassure everyone that class sizes have not increased. While our school has grown overall, the number of children in each class remains the same. In fact, in my first year here we had a mixed-age class of 32 pupils; our largest class today is also 32, which is entirely typical for primary schools.

What has changed and really benefits your children, is that we now teach single-year-group classes. This makes curriculum delivery clearer, more focused, and better matched to children's developmental needs, allowing us to provide even stronger teaching and learning.
