A reminder that as the weather gets hotter, all children will need to have sun cream applied before school each day and should bring a named sun hat to school. Many thanks!





ASSESSMENT UPDATE

You may have heard that the government have removed the requirement for statutory testing in primary schools this year. We will not be required to report results for phonics testing, or for the SATs. However, at Frieth, our intention is to continue with our assessments of children as usual this term, as we consider this is a useful way to track progress as children move through the school. For the statutory assessments in Years 1, 2 and 6, we will use past papers to test the children. All other assessments will be carried out as they normally would. When you receive your child's end of year report, it will include information which tells you whether they have 'met' the expectations for their year group, or whether they are working above or below the level expected for their year group.
