Maths - for children in green, yellow and white groups

LO: The mean.

- Today we are starting a new topic area in maths statistics!

- Then you need to head to <u>Education City</u> and watch the 'learn screen' on the mean which has been set up for you.

English - for all pupils

Today, we are continuing our 'Inside Out' project.

LO: To recognise how we experience different emotions.

- Think back to the work you did last week, based on 'Inside Out'.
- Can you remember the 5 emotions identified in the film? (If not, remind yourself <u>here</u>.)
- Consider the below questions. If an adult is at home, why not discuss this with them?
 - 1. Are all emotions helpful?
 - 2. What does each emotion contribute?
 - 3. When are emotions not helpful?

- Find the sheet called 'Tuesday 9th June English Draw an emotion'. For each emotion, can you draw an instance when you have experienced each one?
- What did the experience of this emotion feel like in your body? Write a sentence underneath your pictures to explain.
- Think about whether there are any emotions that are experienced in the same way (eg smiling or crying) or in the same part of your body? How do we know the difference between the two different emotions if they affect us in the same way?
