2020 has put a strain on the mental health of many people, young and old. Early intervention can be an extremely important step in heading off future issues and can prevent problems from escalating. But in a year when 80% of young people said their mental wellbeing has been made worse by the Covid pandemic and lockdown, it's clear that there's a particular need for wider support for children. Despite the many services that focus on children's mental wellbeing, the single greatest influence and resource can still be found closer to home – in parents.

A recent study found that 80% of parents viewed emotional support as their most important parental duty. But the report also highlighted that many parents felt they needed more support with this. Parents play a hugely important role in their child's mental wellbeing. More than anyone, they are the experts in their child's behaviour and can often spot the signs early on when children might be struggling with their mental health. 

might be suitable. Please just send in your donations throughout the term with your child, passing any glass to an adult on the gate. (We promise it will make it to the hamper!)






Thank you for all your responses about our school values! We will be collating all responses from pupils, parents, staff and governors and will announce our new values soon!
