Drop Offs

Thank you for trying to stick to the suggested timings for morning drop offs. It is so much

smoother for everyone if you can stick to your 'windows'. As a reminder, we are suggesting that Owls and Buzzards without siblings in KS2 try to come as close to 8.45am as possible. Owls and Buzzards with siblings in KS2 aim for the 8.55am crossover time. KS2 pupils without siblings in Owls and Buzzards should come after 9am, but by 9.05am. This should keep us all flowing in nicely and avoid any jams. Could I please also ask that once you have seen your child in through the gate, you move out of the car park area to leave it clear for others? Many thanks.

We heard this week the sad news of the passing of villager John Harris, who I believe may be known to many of you. The funeral is taking place next Friday 9th October. It will be passing the school at around 11.10am and his family have asked if anyone who remembers him or his involvement with the school would like to stand outside the school to show their respects to his funeral procession. PARENTS EVENINGS

As we are unable to hold meetings with our parents due to the current coronavirus risks and guidelines, we have considered how we can best share with parents the information about their child, including how they have settled, what our assessment of their 'gaps' has revealed and what targets they will be working on going forward. Staff have decided that the most effective way to share this information is in a written report, which they have designed. The report will be coming home to you shortly before half term and we hope it will give you a picture at least equal to that you would have had in a face to face meeting. We will be asking for your comments to add to our picture of your child's progress. Should you have any concerns and wish to discuss these with your class teacher, you can speak to them any day at the gate, or can contact the office to make a separate appointment.



Those of you who were at the school last year will remember that the school were seeking to join a MAT (Multi-Academy Trust) so as to benefit from partnership working with like- minded schools. Having researched the options, governors decided that the most suitable trust for Frieth was the ODBST (Oxfordshire Diocese Buckingham Schools Trust). This trust share our ethos and offer a wealth of benefits, from their expertise and high quality training, to their supportive ethos and collaboration.

We are pleased to say that talks with the trust have continued and the governors are ready to take the school on the next stage of its journey towards academisation.

David Cousins, CEO of the ODBST has offered to hold a **meeting with our parents** on the evening of **Tuesday 20th October** in order to answer any

questions which you may have about the process, the result, or whatever else you wish to know. This is likely to be an online meeting. Details of the meeting will follow from the Trust, but please do save the date.
