Outbreak Management Plan

The risk assessment sets out the measures in place to manage transmission of COVID-19 day to day. However, extra action may be taken if the number of positive cases substantially increases. The thresholds, detailed below, will be as indication for when to seek public health advice.

For most education and childcare settings, whichever of these thresholds is reached first:

- 5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period; or
- 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period

Whilst these are guidelines outlined by the DFE, the decision may be taken to contact public health before these thresholds are reached to seek advice on Outbreak Management. Control measures will be proportionate and adequate to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

The following actions may then be taken:

- Re-introducing staff face masks for corridors & communal areas.
- Increase frequency of hand washing.
- Adapting, limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances.
- Use Teams for worship in classrooms.
- Reducing the amount of classes staff work across.
- Increase the number of staff Lateral flow tests per week.
- Re-introducing bubbles and staggered entry/ pick up.
- Limiting all non-essential visitors to school.
- Re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days.
- Re-introduction of temperature checks.
